CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE TRAILS UPDATE

Construction of Fayetteville's most anticipated
trail, Scull Creek Trail, is
progressing rapidly with a
total of 1.2 miles now open
to the public. The 9 member in-house trail construction crew has increased the
productivity and cost efficiency of trail construction
and will continue to work
on Scull Creek Trail until it
is completed. In its entirety, Scull Creek Trail will

be 4 miles in length – connecting from Mud Creek Trail and following Scull Creek south to Wilson Park. From Wilson Park, Scull Creek Trail will become Frisco Trail and continue an additional 0.6 miles south along the Arkansas-Missouri Railroad across Dickson Street to the Walton Arts Center parking lot where it will meet up with Frisco Trail.

Scull Creek Trail is currently the highest priority
trail for the City of Fayetteville because of its central
location and strong northsouth connectivity with
many businesses, parks and
neighborhoods. Once complete, Scull Creek Trail will
form the backbone for the
trail network in the adopted
Fa-

A NATIONAL AUDIENCE HEARS FNHA'S PRESENTATION ON FOREST CONSERVATION ASSESSMENT FOR FAYETTEVILLE

On November 14, Bob
Caulk and Karen RolletCrocker will present a talk
on "How to Select Community Forest Opportunities" at
the National Conference of
Partners in Community Forestry, Baltimore, Maryland.
The conference is sponsored by the National Arbor
Day Foundation and Home
Depot Foundation. FNHA
was selected to make this
presentation because our
forest assessment project

garnered one of 6 honorable mentions for the Home Depot 2007 Awards of Excellence for Community Trees. We were selected by a group of experts in fields of urban forestry, environment and sustainable community development and were showcased at the U.S. Conference of Mayors' meeting in June.

In addition to the invited presentation, Bob and Karen will be attending three days of sessions on topics ranging from trees and community development, social and educational programs, and tree inventory and canopy goals. They expect to return with a considerable store of information and contacts with community forestry organizations and individuals across the country.

They have received funds for travel costs from the Arkansas Forestry Commission 2007 Urban and Community Forestry Assistance Grant in Education (in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service), and the Home Depot Foundation. In return, a brief overview of knowledge gained will be submitted to the Forestry Commission.

Mayor Dan Coody was instrumental in saving Mount Sequoyah Woods, establishing a trail system in Fayetteville and directing our community toward environmental sustain-

City Trails Update

vetteville Alternative Transportation and Trails Master Plan (FATT plan) and provide a safe and efficient alternative transportation route through the heart of Fayetteville. Based on the vision of the FATT plan, numerous other trails including Clabber Creek Trail and Town Branch Creek Trail will extend east and west from this backbone to create an interconnected network of trails. The trails program received a very significant boost with the passing of the September 12th, 2006 transportation bond program. allocating an additional \$2.1 million for trail construction to be used primarily for the completion of Scull Creek Trail.

One of the most important and most challenging aspects of creating an interconnected trail system is right of way acquisition from private property owners. Over the past two years, the City has been actively obtaining multi-use trail easements and property for



Scull Creek trail. Thanks to the great support from the property owners along Scull Creek, right of way has been obtained from 17 properties resulting in 17.54 acres or 2.5 miles of trail corridor. Of these 17 properties, 14 donated the easement or land free of charge to the City. Currently, access from only 9 properties remains to complete the connection from Mud Creek Trail to Frisco Trail and negotiations are underway with several nearing final signatures. Support from property owners is essential to the realization of the dream of an interconnected network of trails within the City of Fayetteville.

Currently the trail construction crew is nearing completion of Phase II of Scull Creek Trail. This 1.2 mile section will connect from Gordon Long Park south through a newly installed tunnel under Gregg Street and along the east side of the University of Arkansas Agri Farm, crossing Poplar Street near Chestnut apartments and on to Sycamore Street. Lighting will be included at regular intervals along the entire trail to allow for extended use, safety and increased flexibility as a transportation route for commuters. Design of the five trail bridges over

Scull Creek is also underway with anticipated installation by the end of this year. Benches will also be included along the trail to take in the scenic views of Scull Creek.

In addition to Scull Creek Trail, the trail construction crew is finishing up work on Hamestring Creek Trail, a 0.62 mile trail through Wildwood Park, just west of I-540 in the Pine Valley Subdivision. Over the past year, the trails crew has completed a 1.2 mile extension of Lake Fayetteville Trail and a 0.65 mile section of Clabber Creek Trail. In addition to continued construction of Scull Creek Trail, construction will soon begin on the first section of Owl Creek Trail from the new Owl Creek School west to Broyles Ave.
